

## MLA Documentation for Citing Documents from SIRS and EBSCO

**-PLEASE NOTE: All citations should be double-spaced-  
ALSO: Second lines, and all consecutive lines of text should be indented  
½ inch from the initial line of text.**

**IMPORTANT**, if one part of the citation is unavailable, go to the next.  
*For example: If there is no author, start your citation with the title of the article.*

1. Last name of author, first name.
2. Title of article in quotes.
3. Name of publication -underlined
4. Month day, year of publication:
5. Page number(s).
6. Name of database (SIRS Researcher or EBSCOhost).
7. The word Web.
8. Day month year you accessed the article.

### **Examples:**

Grossman, Lev. "Meet Joe Blog." Time June. 2004: 21-54. SIRS Researcher.  
Web. 17 Nov. 2005.

Grossman, Lev. "Meet Joe Blog." Time June. 2004: 21-54. EBSCOhost. Web.  
17 Nov. 2005.
