

MLA Documentation for Citing Documents from SIRS and EBSCO

-PLEASE NOTE: All citations should be double-spaced-

► **IMPORTANT**, if one part of the citation is unavailable, go to the next.
For example: **If there is no author**, start your citation with the title of the article.

1. Last name of author, first name.
2. Title of article in quotes.
3. Name of publication -underlined
4. Day month year of publication:
5. Page number(s).
6. Name of database (SIRS Researcher or Academic Search Elite).
7. Name of the service (SIRS Knowledge Source or EBSCOhost).
Note: When citing EBSCOhost, "EBSCO" is always uppercase, and "host" is always in lowercase, *italics*.
8. The name of the library or library system (Lackawanna College, Seeley Memorial Library), City, State abbreviated.
9. Day month year you accessed the article
10. The URL of the service (<http://www.sirs.com> or <http://www.epnet.com>).
