101 Ethical Dilemmas / Cohen, Martin. 170 C678O 2003.
A chatty, jokey journey through philosophical dilemmas, ancient and modern... but the philosophy is the real thing.

The Complete Idiot's Guide to Understanding Ethics / Ingram, David, 170 I54C c2002.
What is unique about this book is the explanations of real-life situations. The authors discuss Affirmative Action, abortion, discrimination and other issues.

Ethics : Collections from Classical and Contemporary Writers / 170 J66E c1999.
Chronologically oriented, the book's unbiased and comprehensive coverage fosters a firm grasp of many seminal ideas and thinkers in the history of Western ethics.

Social Ethics : Morality and Social Policy/ Mappes, Thomas A. 170 M297S c1992.
Provides material that will encourage reflective and critical examination of key contemporary moral problems.

Business Ethics / Ferrell, O. C. 174.4 F383B c2005.
As the core of undergraduate and graduate courses or as a supplement to other books, Business Ethics remains the established resource for accessible and up-to-date coverage of applied ethics.

Animal Rights and Human Morality/ Rollin, Bernard E. 179.3 R754A 2006.
Bernard E. Rollin—now widely recognized as the father of veterinary ethics—develops a compelling analysis of animal rights as it is emerging in society. He believes that society must elevate the moral status of animals and protect their rights as determined by their natures. The result is a sound basis for rational discussion and social policy development in this area of rapidly growing concern.

Morality in Practice / 303.372 S838M 1993.
Providing broad coverage of topics and opinions, Sterba draws from current journalism as well as philosophy to present opposing viewpoints on critical contemporary issues.

Sports Ethics: An Anthology / Boxill, Jan 796.01 B788S 2003.
An anthology of essays from various writers, this volume "...examines philosophical issues such as sportsmanship, violence, cheating, drug use, racism, sexism, and gender equality, and gives the reader an understanding of the moral significance of sports."

Taking Sides / R 016.301 T 1992-1994.
The "Taking Sides" series explores a wide range of ethical and moral issues, discussing divergent viewpoints.

Encyclopedia of Ethics / R 170.3 E56E Vol. 2 1992.
This generally well-written and well-edited encyclopedia covers mostly academic ethics as practiced in the English-speaking world, though it also covers aspects of moral philosophy in other cultures.

Bioethics for Students / R 174 P85B 1999.
In four volumes, this reference book discusses ethical issues pertaining to medicine, animal rights, the environment, and other areas. There is also a glossary in the back of the fourth volume.

Endgame: Ethics and Values in America / VID 170 E84E 2002.
From PBS, this video offers "lively debate on profound moral, ethical and social dilemmas that affect our modern world" along with "conversations about the tough decisions each of us face in our everyday lives."

Moral development / VID 301.15 M82M 1984.
Examines two of the major theories in the field of moral development by using Dr. Stanley Milgrim's famous obedience experiment to pose a serious moral dilemma. Features Dr. David Rosenhan.
